GENERAL CLUB COMPETITION RULES

Eligibility

Eligibility for competitions in 2025 will, once again, be conditional on friendlies played during 2024.

To be eligible to enter the Club Competitions, excluding the men's and ladies 4-wood singles¹, members must have made themselves available to play in 3 home and 3 away club games throughout the previous outdoor season. The away games exclude Witney Mills and West Witney BC matches and do not include any Men's, Ladies West Ox, County or National League games.

The Club Committee reserve the right to declare members eligible if, for example, they were unable to enter previous season's friendlies due to health issues.

Entry Fee and Rink Fees

Entry fees are £1 per person per event. Rink fees of £1 per person are payable for each match after the first round, excluding the final, and these fees will be collected after all the rounds have been completed. Rink fees will not be applied to games that are conceded. However, the associated walkover must be clearly indicated by players in the Club Competition folder in the clubhouse.

The Challenger

The Challenger, the first named player, is responsible for arranging the date/time for each round, within 2 weeks following from the first day of the competition and 1 week of subsequent rounds. The challenger shall offer 3 sets of dates/times, 1 of which shall be a weekend. If this procedure is not adhered to the person being challenged shall become the Alternative Challenge (see below). The Challenger shall also book the rink, and in the case of a

singles match, the marker, offering the opponent(s) a minimum of 3 rinks, where 3 rinks or more are available.

The Alternative Challenger shall have 1 week to take similar action to the original challenger. The original Challenger must accept one of the 3 dates offered or forfeit the match.

All games must be completed by the Play-By date for the round. If the above procedure is adhered to but a play date is not set to be before or on the Play-By date then the player/team declining the offered dates shall forfeit the match.

Selecting a Rink

The challenger shall select three rinks from those available. The three rink numbers will be placed in a bag and the opposition shall select the rink to be used from the bag.

Seeded Players

Ladies and Men's Singles competitions only will have 4 seeded players who will not, if possible, be placed in any preliminary round. Seeds 1 and 4 will be in the top half of the draw and seeds 2 and 3 in the bottom. Seeds will be chosen by the Selection Committee.

Handicaps

Handicaps are set by the Selection Committee.

Disputes

Must be referred to the Club Committee via the Competitions Secretary.

Substitutions

In pairs or team games, substitutes must be referred to and agreed by Club Committee via the Competitions Secretary.

Stoppage of Play

If, for any reason, play stops after 10 ends have been played then the position at that time shall count. If for any reason play stops and less than 10 ends have been played and there is insufficient time to rearrange the game before the date shown on the competition list, the match will be decided by the Competition Secretary after tossing a coin.

Failure or Lateness to Appear

Any competitor or team who fails to appear with 15 minutes of the time fixed for starting shall forfeit the game.

Dress Codes

Players - Dress is club shirts and navy blues for all rounds, including the final.

Markers - For all singles games, including finals, markers should be dressed in navy blues with a white or club shirt.

Score Cards

Score cards must show the competition name and the names of all players. In the case of singles competitions both players must sign the completed score cards. In the case of pairs competitions both skips must sign the score cards. Signed cards must be deposited in the box in the clubhouse.

Competition Finals

Competition entrants must be available to play on at least two of the Club Finals Days: Friday 29th, Saturday 30th and Sunday 31st August 2025.

SPECIFIC RULES OF PLAY FOR EACH COMPETITION

For each specific competition the rules shown in the following table must be observed.

Members should note, in particular, the special rules applying to the Club Championship, Handicap and Points competitions.

Apart from the above rules, Bowls England Rules shall apply.

Club Champion²

The match comprises of TWO sets of 9 ends each. The winner will be the one who wins both sets. A coin is tossed to decide control of the mat, the control of the mat alternates for each set.

If after two sets have been played there is a draw then a THREE-end tie-break will be played. A coin will be tossed to decide control of the mat for the first tie-break end. After the first tie-break end, control of the mat then alternates irrespective of who wins each end. In the tie-break the player who has the bowl nearest the jack wins the end and the player who wins TWO ends is the winner.

This singles competition is not seeded.

APPENDIX A – ONE-DAY COMPETITIONS 2025

Derek Eeles Trophy³

Format

The Derek Eeles Trophy is traditionally the first of our summer one-day competitions for Witney Town members only. As such, new members and new bowlers will find it a good way to meet and play against more experienced players. This year it is being played on the afternoon of Bank Holiday Monday 5th May 2025 starting at 1:00 p.m.

This is a 3-wood mixed triples event for 12 teams, so a maximum of 36 members can play. Players are allocated as leads, 2s and skips then drawn into teams.

Each team played 3 rounds of 40 minutes. Teams will be in 2 groups with the winner of each group then playing a final. The format may be changed depending on the number of entries.

The finishing time will be approximately 5:30-6:00 p.m. Light refreshments will be provided. The entry fee is £3.50.

Rules

- The event is 3-wood triples.
- Players will be drawn into teams for the afternoon.
- Teams will be drawn into 2 groups of 6 teams. Each team will play 3 rounds of 40 minutes each.
- Teams will toss for the mat, winner of the toss may choose to keep or give away the mat.
- Jacks may be set before the opening bell; do not set the jack after the closing bell.
- There will be a count of only 1 shot on the first 2 ends of the first match of the day.
- The winner of the group is the team with the highest total aggregate number of shots. In the event of a tie within the group the winner will be decided by result between the teams; then number of games won; then number of ends won; then by the toss of a coin.
- Nos. 1 and 2 must not leave the mat end until all their bowls have been delivered; skips should leave the head together and may not visit the head.
- If the jack is knocked out of play and the end declared dead 2 shots shall be conceded to the opposing team.
- The order of play within the team may alter from round to round but may not alter during a round.
- The final between the 2 Group winners will be of 6 ends.
- In all other respects Bowls England rules will apply.
- Dress code: navy blues.

Willett Plate⁴

Format

This event will be played on the afternoon of Sunday 6th July 2025 starting at 1:00 p.m.

It is a 2-wood triples event for a 12 teams.

Light refreshments will be provided. The entry fee is £3.50.

Rules

- The event is 2-wood triples event for all Witney Town members.
- The event is limited to 12 teams.
- The teams will be drawn and placed into 2 groups.
- All teams will play 3 rounds of 40 minutes.
- There will be 1 shot to count on the first 2 ends of the day only.
- Teams will toss for the mat, winner of the toss may choose to keep or give away the mat.
- Nos. 1 and 2 must not leave the mat end until all their bowls have been delivered and skips must not visit the head.
- If the jack is knocked out of play and the end declared dead 2 shots and the mat shall be conceded to the opposing team. The end counts.
- The order of play within the team may alter from round to round but may not alter during a round.
- Two points will be awarded for a win and one point for a draw.
- The winners of the groups will be decided on points scored. In the event of two or more teams in a group having the same number of points the Group winner will be:
 - o The team with the highest shot difference. Then, if still tying
 - o The team with the most ends won. Then, if still tying
 - The team with the most shots scored. Then, if still tying
 - The toss of a coin.
- The final will be of 8 ends between: Winner of Group 1 v Winner of Group 2.
- In all other respects Bowls England rules will apply.
- Dress code: navy blues.
- The format may be changed depending on the number of entries.

Derek Adams Memorial Trophy⁵

Format

This event will be played on Bank Holiday Monday 25th August 2025 starting at 1:00 p.m.

It is a 3-wood triples event where individual scores decide the winner. Players and playing positions are drawn each round.

Light refreshments will be provided. The entry fee is £3.50.

Rules

- Triples will be played with 3 woods.
- Every player in each round will pick out from the bag. Obey the position you are given to play according to the disk drawn. The disk will also indicate the rink and the team colour you are with.
- If a blank is drawn, sit out and score the average of all the teams that played that round. From then on you draw before the blanks are reintroduced.
- Each round will be timed at 40 minutes with a 5 minute break between rounds.
- Set the first jack but do not bowl the first wood until the starting bell. Do not set a jack after the finishing bell.
- Each player is responsible for his or her own scores. Whatever your team scores is your score. At the end of each round, please tell the event supervisor your score.
- There are no trial ends.
- Skips may not visit the head.
- Jack off the side of the rink will be counted as two shots away.
- At the end of the event the individual scores will be totalled. A single wood will be played to settle a draw; the jack being set by a third party.
- Apart from the above, Bowls England rules apply.
- Dress code: navy blues.

The format may be changed depending on the number of entries.

Yardstick Competition

Format

This competition is organised on an ad hoc basis, sometimes as an afternoon substitute for cancelled events. Because of this the format is fairly fluid.

However, the event is normally a 3-wood triples competition that has been designed to encourage all our new members to try an afternoon of competitive bowls.

The entry fee is £3.50 per player.

Refreshments will be tea and biscuits provided during the course of the afternoon.

This event will be played on the afternoon of Sunday 3rd August 2025 starting at 1:00 p.m.

Typical Rules

- Players will be drawn into teams for the afternoon. Each team will have 3 timed matches of 40 minutes. Teams can change their order of play for each round but may not change it during the round.
- When the jack is delivered it is centred and the starting position marked by a coin. If the jack is moved during the end, it is returned to its original position. When the end is completed, all woods within 1 yard of the jack will count as a point.
- The winner of the Group is the team with the highest total aggregate number of points. In the event of a tie within the Group the winner will be decided by the result between those teams, failing that a 1 end shoot-out between the teams with 1 wood per player.
- Teams will toss for the mat, winner of the toss may choose to keep or give away the mat.
- Nos. 1 and 2 must not leave the mat end until all their bowls have been delivered and skips must not visit the head.
- If the jack is knocked out of play 5 points shots shall be awarded to the opposing team.
- In all other respects Bowls England rules will apply.
- Dress code: navy blues.
- The format may be changed depending on the number of entries.

<u>APPENDIX B – FRIDAY EVENING PAIRS LE</u>AGUE RULES 2025

(Also Known as the Halls Cup⁶)

- This 4-wood mixed pairs KO competition will be played on Friday evenings.
- Teams enter as a pair i.e. they are not drawn.
- The rink fee is £2.00 per pair per round.
- All matches are to start between 6:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.
- The competition is limited to 10 pairs and the following format may be modified if a full entry level is not achieved.
- Pairs will be divided into two groups, within which each pair will play other pairs in the group once.
- Each match is over 10 ends, no trial ends, with 2 points for a win and 1 point for a draw.
- Skips may not visit the head.
- If a jack is moved off a side of the rink then it is 2 shots away and the end counts.
- If conditions become unplayable during a match then the score will stand if at least 6 ends have been completed.
- A substitute may be allowed but only on the grounds of illness or county competitions.
- Match dates during 2025 are expected to be as follows:
 - o Friday 4th July, Round 1
 - o Friday 18th July, Round 2
 - o Friday 25th July, Round 3
 - o Friday 1st August, Round 4
 - o Friday 15th August, Semi-Finals
- Semi-finals will be between the winner of Group A and the runner-up of Group B, and vice-versa.
- Positions in a group will be decided according to the following hierarchy:
 - Number of points, then
 - o Number of wins, then
 - o Results between the 2 teams, then
 - Shot difference, then
 - o Shots won, then
 - o Ends won, then
 - The toss of a coin.
- The final will be played during the club Finals Weekend on 29th, 30th and 31st August
 2025.
- Apart from the above rules, Bowls England Rules shall apply.
- Dress code: navy blues.

APPENDIX C – SHORT MAT PAIRS COMPETITION RULES 2026

- This is a competition for 12 pairs teams to be played with 3 woods.
- The 12 teams will be divided into 2 groups of 6. Each team will play the other 5 teams in their group.
- Teams may alter their order of play between rounds, but not during a round.
- A final will be played between the winners of the two groups.
- Each match will be of 6 ends.
- Set the first jack but do not bowl the first wood until the starting bell. There are no trial ends. For all rounds, all shots count.
- Skips may not visit the head at any time and should leave the head together.
- If the jack leaves the side of the rink it will be counted as 3 shots away and the end counts.
- The match result will be 2 points for a win, and 1 point for a draw.
- Positions in a group will be decided according to the following hierarchy:
 - Number of points, then
 - Shot difference, then
 - The result between those teams
- Apart from the above, ESMBA⁷ rules apply.
- The match fee is £3.50 per person. This includes the cost of one hot drink.
- Players should bring their own lunch.
- Competition dates during 2026 are:
 - Sunday TBD January arrive at 9:30 for 10:00 a.m.
 - Sunday TBD February arrive at 9:30 for 10:00 a.m.
 - Sunday TBD March arrive at 9:30 for 10:00 a.m.
- Dress code: navy blues.

The format may be changed depending on the number of entries.

APPENDIX D – SHORT MAT SINGLES COMPETITION RULES 2026

- This is a competition for 12 players to be played with 4 woods.
- The 12 players will be divided into 2 groups of 6. Each player will play the other 5 players in their group.
- Semi-finals (time permitting) will be played between the winner of group A and the runner-up of group B, and vice-versa.
- An overall final will be played.
- Each match will be of 7 ends.
- Set the first jack but do not bowl the first wood until the starting bell. There are no trial ends. For all rounds, all shots count.
- Everyone entering should expect to mark/referee for at least 3 games when not playing.
- Marker sets the jack as requested.
- Players may not visit the head at any time.
- If the jack leaves the side of the rink it will be counted as 2 shots away and the end counts.
- The match result will be 3 points for a win, and 1 point for a draw.
- Positions in a group will be decided according to the following hierarchy:
 - Number of points, then
 - Shot difference, then
 - The result between those players.
- Apart from the above, ESMBA⁸ rules apply.
- The match fee is £3.50 per person. This includes the cost of one hot drink.
- Players should bring their own lunch.
- Competition dates during 2026 are:
 - Sunday TBD March arrive at 9:30 for 10:00 a.m.
 - Sunday TBD April arrive at 9:30 for 10:00 a.m.
- Dress code: navy blues.

The format may be changed depending on the number of entries.
